### CATS & KITTENS

When available for adoption, all cats are kittens:

- Are neutered/spayed
- Are microchipped
- Are vaccinated
- Are health checked
- Have received flea and worm treatment
- Are covered by Petplan Insurance for up to 4 weeks

### RABBITS

When available for adoption, all rabbits:

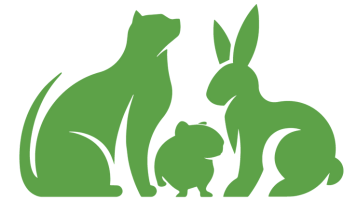
- Are neutered/spayed
- Are health checked
- Are vaccinated
- Have received flea and worm treatment
- Are covered by Petplan Insurance for up to 4 weeks

An adoption fee of £40 is requested for all rabbits. This is less than 1/4 of the cost of all of the above.

### GUINEA PIGS

When available for adoption, all guinea pigs are health checked. An adoption fee of £15 is requested for all guinea pigs. This is less than 1/2 of the full costs.

Please note we only rehome rabbits and guinea pigs in pairs or we can bond a single rabbit or guinea pig with yours!

## What We Do

We operate across West Sussex and Hampshire, helping those struggling with an unmanageable number of animals in their home, those whose circumstances have changed and can no longer take care of their pets, and those who have found stray or feral animals at their property or other locations.

Upon arrival at The Cat & Rabbit Rescue Centre, all animals are given a health check by our Vet and provided any medical treatment required plus some much-needed TLC from our dedicated Animal Care staff. Before rehoming, where required, all animals are:

- Neutered/Spayed
- Vaccinated
- Health/Dental Checked

Once animals are ready for adoption, all potential adopters are subject to checks to ensure the suitability of their household and lifestyle to their new furry friend.

We are actively involved in the management of feral cat colonies which without intervention, can spiral out of control and leave cats short of food, susceptible to disease and potentially a nuisance to their human neighbours.

We enter communities and humanely trap cats in colonies to assess them. Medication and veterinary treatment, if required, is administered in addition to neutering/spaying these cats back at our Centre. We then help to find them a welcome home in other locations like farms where they are effective in controlling mice, whilst kittens can be domesticated and rehomed conventionally.
